Ministerial Regulations

Prescribing the Fields of Engineering Profession and Regulated Engineering Profession (No. 2),
B.E. 2560 (A.D. 2017)

By virtue of the definitions of “engineering profession” and “regulated engineering profession” in Section 4 and paragraph one of Section 5 of the Engineer Act, B.E. 2542 (A.D. 1999), the Minister of Interior hereby issues this Ministerial Regulations as follows:

The provision of Clause 1 of the Ministerial Regulations Prescribing the Fields of Engineering Professions and Regulated Engineering Professions, B.E. 2550 (A.D. 2007), shall be repealed and replaced by the following provisions:

“Clause 1. The following fields of engineering shall be engineering profession:

- (1) Agricultural engineering;
- (2) Computer engineering;
- (3) Chemical engineering;
- (4) Coastal engineering;
- (5) Biomedical engineering;
- (6) Naval engineering;
- (7) Building maintenance engineering;
- (8) Fire protection engineering;
- (9) Petroleum engineering;
- (10) Energy engineering;
- (11) Mechatronic engineering;
- (12) Automobile engineering;
- (13) Railway systems engineering;
- (14) Information engineering;
- (15) Survey engineering;
- (16) Environmental engineering;

- (17) Water resources engineering;
- (18) Aircraft engineering;
- (19) Food engineering.”

Remark:- The reason for promulgating this Ministerial Regulations is that determination of the fields of engineering professions under the Ministerial Regulations Prescribing the Fields of Engineering Profession and Regulated Engineering Profession, B.E. 2550 (A.D. 2007), is not in conformity with the current circumstance where engineering has progressed quickly. It is deemed appropriate to add more fields of engineering professions to cover the emerging fields of engineering professions as Thailand is obliged to do so under the ASEAN Mutual Recognition Arrangement on Engineering Services and the ASEAN Free Trade Area in order to enhance those practicing the engineering professions to be well prepared and capable to compete with other countries in terms of provision of engineering services. Thus, it is necessary to issue this Ministerial Regulations.
